Statewide Child Support Program: Establishment of Child Support Cases and Orders

Department of Health and Human Services October 1, 2012 through August 22, 2016

Recommendation 1: Improvements needed in making timely determinations for good cause claims.

The OAG recommended that MDHHS make timely determinations of custodial parents' good cause claims for not cooperating with establishing paternity and/or child support orders. The OAG also recommended that MDHHS properly reduce or terminate the public assistance benefits of custodial parents who do not cooperate in establishing paternity and/or child support orders.

Response

MDHHS agrees with the recommendations. However, the Office of Child Support (OCS) does not determine good cause for clients, nor does it terminate assistance benefits. MDHHS's OCS and the Economic Stability Administration (ESA) (formally Field Operations Administration) have convened a workgroup to look at the process and recommend training and system improvements. However, OCS and ESA have not been able to implement any changes to systems, policy or training. Once the Work Requests, that include alerts for overdue pending good cause determinations, MiCSES/Bridges interface updates and correspondence updates are prioritized, OCS and ESA will be able to implement changes recommended by the work group. Currently, MDHHS is unable to have these WRs prioritized. OCS and ESA will continue to provide guidance and support to local office workers to ensure policy is followed. The workgroup has written work requests for technical changes within Bridges and MiBridges, however, the work requests are not scheduled to be prioritized until 2020 or later.

OCS and ESA are currently working on updating trainings as well as language on applications and forms.
