Summary of Agency Responses to Recommendations

1. Audit recommendations Agencies (MDHHS, Treasury) and DTMB do not plan further remediation: #1a
2. Audit recommendations Agency MDARD agreed with and will remediate: #1a and 1b

Agencies Responses to Recommendations:

Finding 1 – Improvements Needed to Interface Controls Over the EDW

For part a., Treasury, MDHHS, DTMB, and MDARD agree that interfaces should be documented based on business needs.

For MDHHS, Treasury, and DTMB, the current EDW interface documentation meets the business needs. MDHHS and DTMB will update existing EDW interface documentation only upon the next request for interface modification by the business. The interface documentation meets current business needs. Treasury updated the interface documentation for the one exception during the audit.

DTMB reviewed and updated the EDW Best Practice Guideline to reference appropriate Standards of Michigan Standards (November 2023), including references to the State's System Engineering Methodology (SEM), which is a component of the State's Unified Information Technology Environment (SUITE) and removed references to FISCAM. In accordance with the State of Michigan Administrative Guide to State Government, 1360.00, State Agencies follow the State's System Engineering methodology for IT projects, which includes the development of interfaces.

For part a and part b., MDARD agrees that reconciliation interface controls should be more fully documented based on business needs. MDARD will continue to update the documentation based on business needs, business prioritization, and available resources (June 30, 2024).

MDARD provides their own IT support for MDARD's EDW processes. In addition, the SCAO is not an executive branch agency and as such the SCAO provides their own IT support for the SCAO's EDW processes. As such, DTMB Agency Services does not provide IT support to the MDARD or SCAO EDW.
