Summary of Agency Response to Recommendation

1. Audit recommendation DTMB agreed with and will remediate: #1

DTMB Final Corrective Action Plan:

Finding 1 – Improved security configuration controls needed to protect UNIX operating systems

DTMB agrees with the importance of effective operating system configuration controls. DTMB also agrees with the need to document tailored configuration settings appropriate for the State of Michigan's environment.

As part of the process to ensure a server is operational and the server meets the Agencies' business needs, DTMB tailors the configurations to ensure the server will function appropriately.

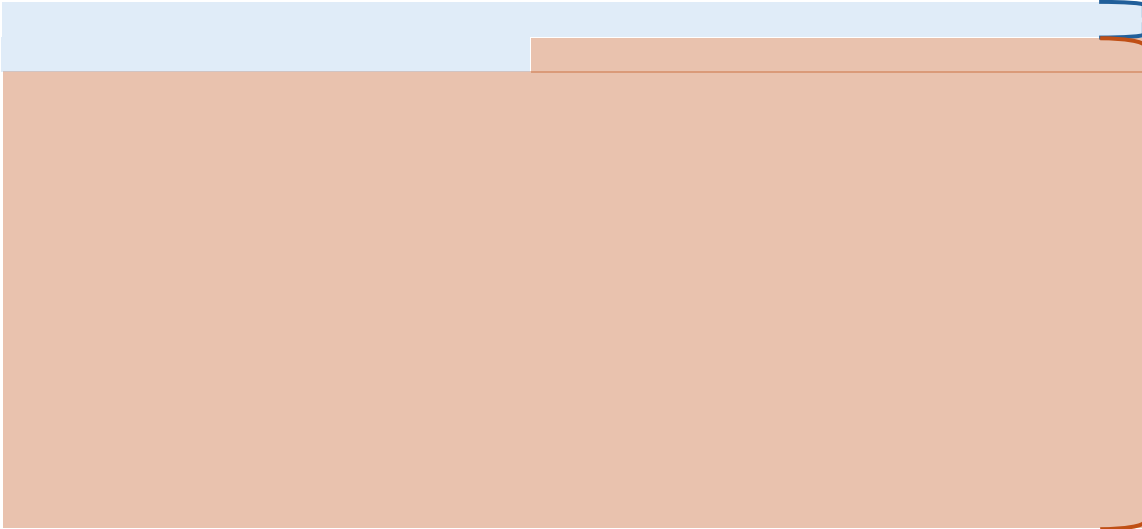
DTMB documents the final operational configurations for a server within the operating system. Tailoring is documented using a controlled workflow and approval process.

DTMB updated the documentation for the tailored operating system configurations applied at the time a server is initially built to reflect changes in configurations applied to servers at the time a server is initially hardened (July 2024).

DTMB is reviewing deployed UNIX servers and assessing deviations from the tailored baseline (January 2025).

Comment on CAP from Michigan Office of the Auditor General (05/23/2025, 11:00 AM)

DTMB documented tailored configurations in their build configuration standards, however, these were only for blank UNIX servers. Once operational, DTMB further tailored configurations to ensure the application would function appropriately. These final configurations were not always documented. Therefore, we were unable to determine if these were security risks or tailored configurations.

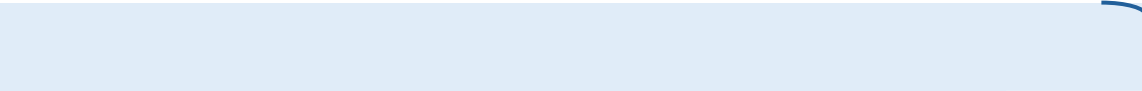
